

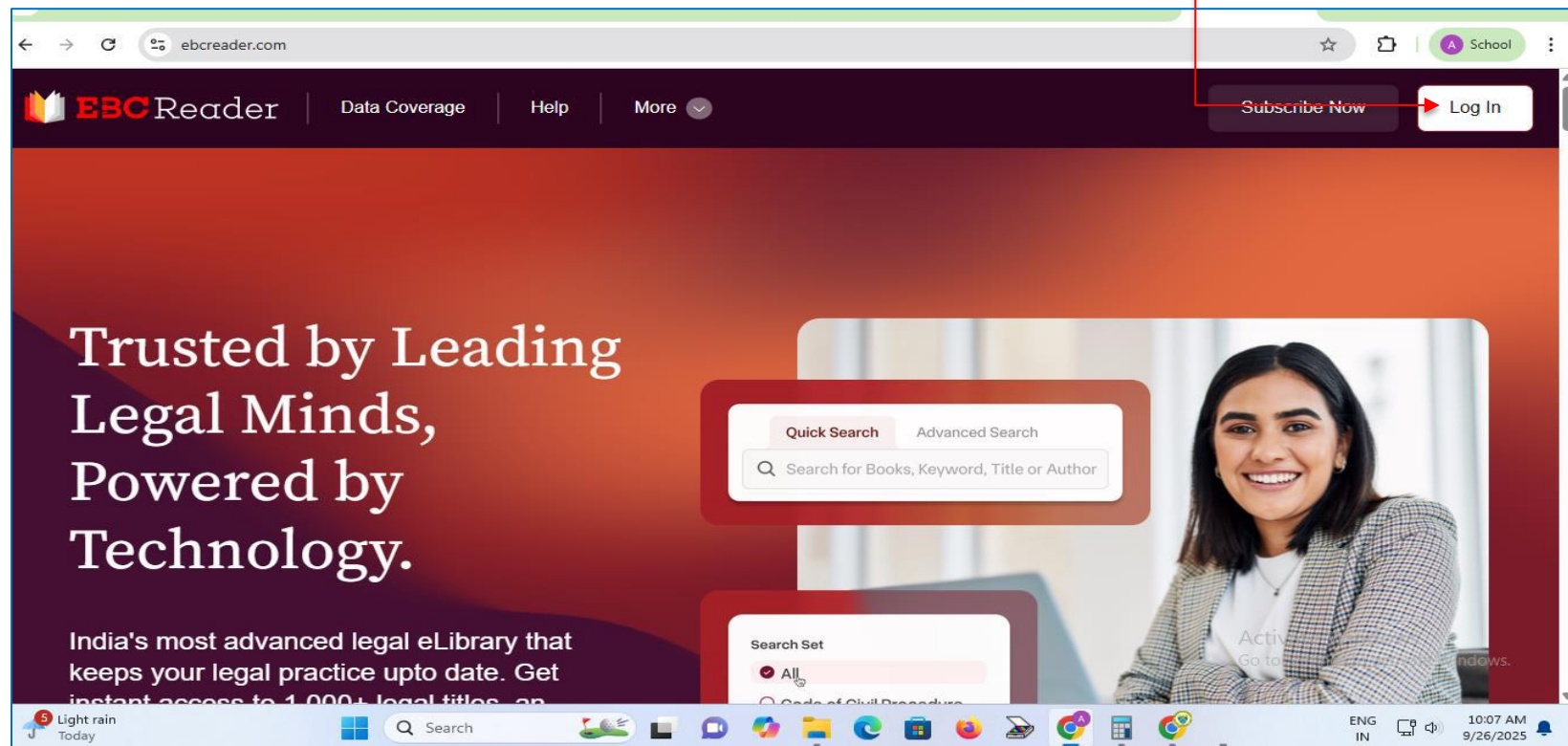


About EBC Reader

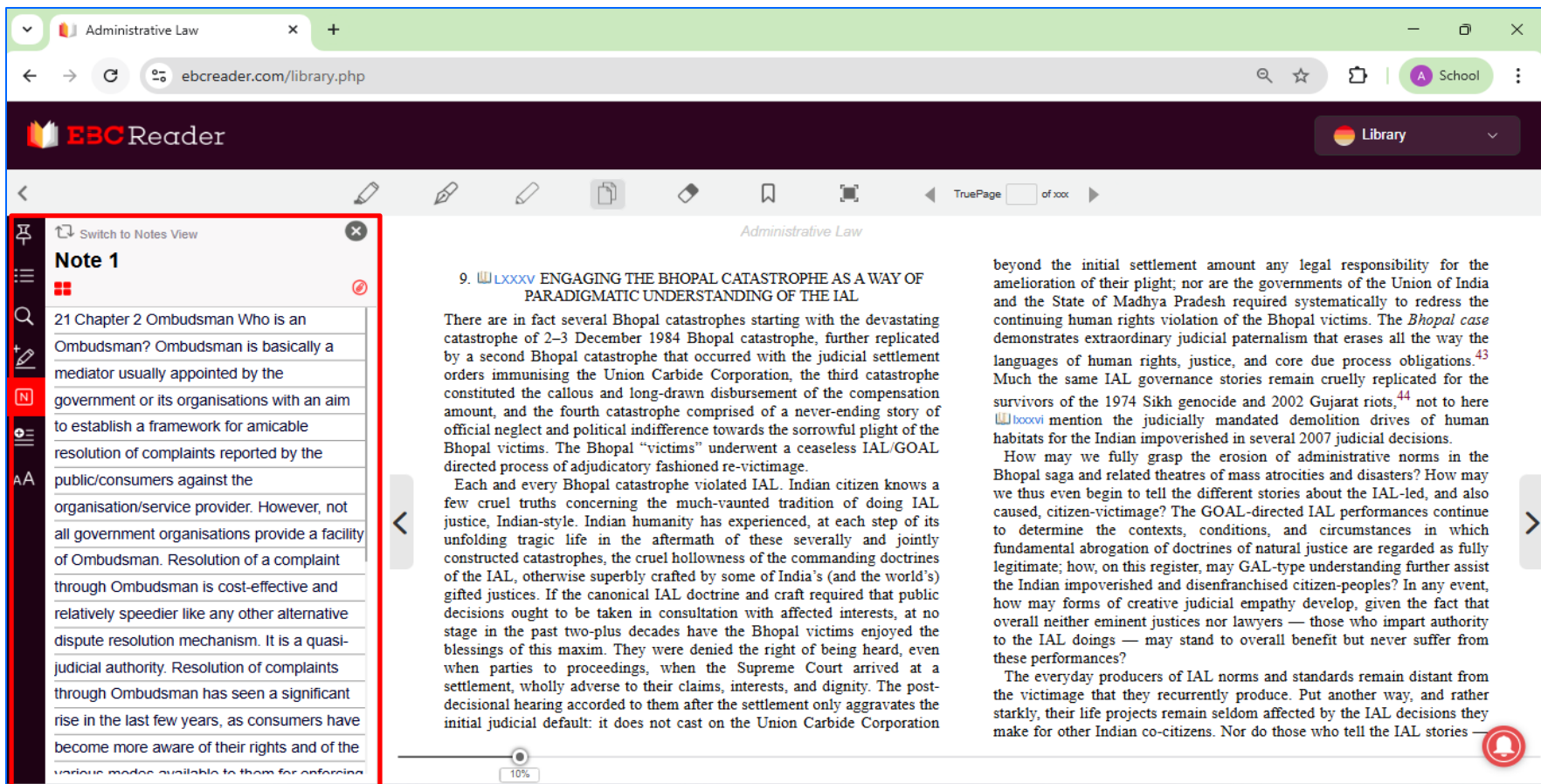

- If you want to copy some portion of the book, then you can click on the 'Copy to Note' icon in the above screenshot and then select the portion which you want to copy and click on Copy to Note black button which is recently popped up.
